





Cut-off Points 2023 (Nett L1R5)



O Level vs A Level Curriculum





JC1 Promotional Criteria

- Must obtain:
 - At least 30 rank points, including a pass in GP
 - This excludes HI Mother Tongue language
- Pass = At least an 'E' grade
- Students who do not meet the promotional criteria are expected to re-do their JCI in 2024

Moving up from JC1 to JC2

- Students who read 4H2 content-based subjects but do not obtain an average 'C' for these subjects are expected to downgrade one of the subjects to H1 level
- Students who excel in the exams may be invited to read one or two H3 content-based subjects in JC2 based on availability and their capabilities

University Admission Criteria

- 3 H2 + 1 H1 (content-based subjects) + GP + PW
- A minimum of 'S' grade in Mother-tongue language
- Attempted GP and all content-based subjects in the same sitting at GCE 'A' Level exams




How can You Support Your Child?
